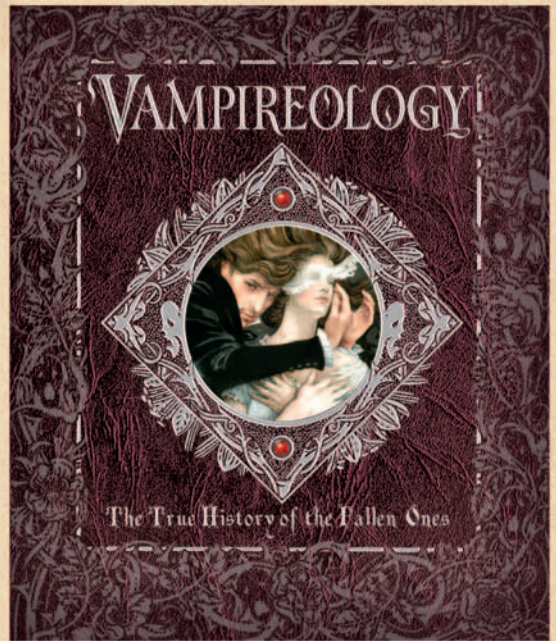

Soon after Brooks's death, Kraik is contacted by a woman called Magdalena who claims to have been a former lover of the deceased. She explains that she is looking for a book that she suspects is in Kraik's possession. Although he is fascinated by her beauty and poetic manner, Kraik suspects that she is a vampire and decides to go to Venice and destroy her. Kraik now understands that the role of Protector is his. Fearing that the book may fall into the wrong hands, he sends it back to his solicitor for safe keeping. *Vampireology* ends with two newspaper articles – one about a strange occurrence in Venice and the disappearance of a British detective; the other about a ransacking of the solicitor's office in London. The reader is left wondering about Kraik's fate and the future of mankind at the hands of the Fallen Ones.
